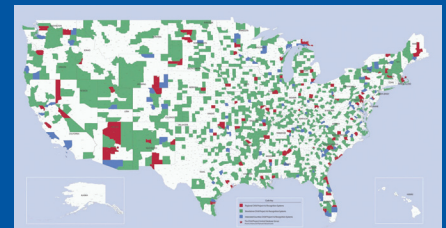

The CHILD Project™ is a secure, web-based nationwide network and registry, hosted by the Nation's Missing Children Organization and National Center for Missing Adults – that enables Sheriffs' Offices and social service agencies across the nation to enroll, locate and positively identify missing children in seconds using iris biometric recognition technology.



The CHILD Project™ system is fast and easy to use. The high-resolution and non-invasive camera takes a digital snapshot of the iris and creates a 688-byte code. This code is securely stored and is only accessible to authorized users and identity is verified within seconds.

With the support of the NSA, more than 70% of the nation's Sheriffs have already asked to participate in The Child Project. Since its inception, the Child Project has been implemented in 25 states.



Endorsed by the National Sheriffs' Association (NSA), and hosted by The Nation's Missing Children Organization and National Center for Missing Adults, The Children's Identification & Location Database (CHILD) Project positively identifies children using the most mathematically unique biometric – the iris.
