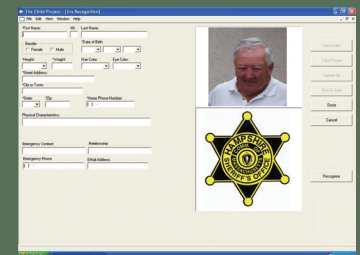

Senior Safety Net™ is a secure, web-based national network and registry hosted by the National Center for Missing Adults – that enables Sheriffs' Offices and social service agencies

across the nation to enroll, locate and positively identify missing persons using iris biometric recognition technology. The system is fast and easy use. A person is enrolled by simply taking a digital photo of their eyes. The system stores a unique 688-byte code of each eye to the national database. Once enrolled, the identity of the person and vital contact information can be verified in seconds.
